*In this project, students enter the web site to plan, reserve and budget a two-week vacation, including on-line bookings of flight, hotel and rental car. The project is divided into four parts: (1) Choose a destination; (2) Hotel reservations; (3) Flights; (4) Rental cars, and (5) Adding up the cost of the trip*

1. Let's **choose a destination** before we book a flight, hotel and rental car. Your teacher will assign you ONE of the destinations below by circling it on your paper (every student gets a different destination):

Las Vegas, Nevada	San Antonio, Texas	Los Angeles, California	Miami, Florida	Honolulu, Hawaii
San Francisco, California	Key West, Florida	London	Houston, Texas	Stockholm, Sweden

2. First make **hotel reservations**. Click on **Hotels** and type the City, American State or international country names into the dialog boxes (your teacher has circled them in the table above). Choose also the dates of check-in and check-out. **MAKE ALL RESERVATIONS FOR 10 DAYS**. Then click on **Find**. Here's an **example**. (your city destination will be the one your teacher circles in the box above).
